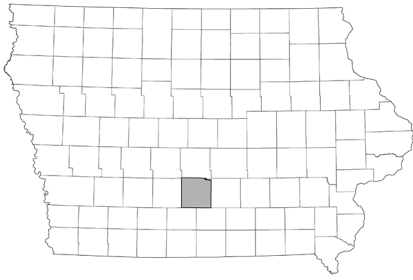

Population Profile

The 2017 population estimate for Bevington is 69. Between 2010 and 2017 the population increased by 9.5%. The City of Bevington is in Warren County. Warren County saw a 8.5% population increase between 2010 and 2017. Bevington's population is predominantly White. Between 2000 and 2010 there was a slight increase in the percent of White population.

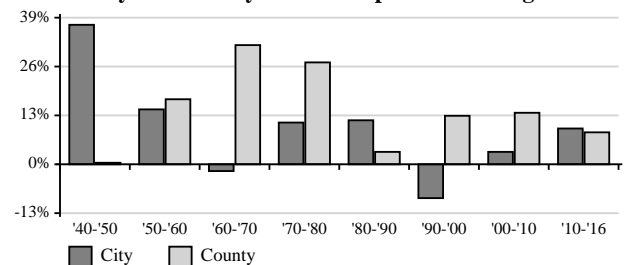

Demographic Profile

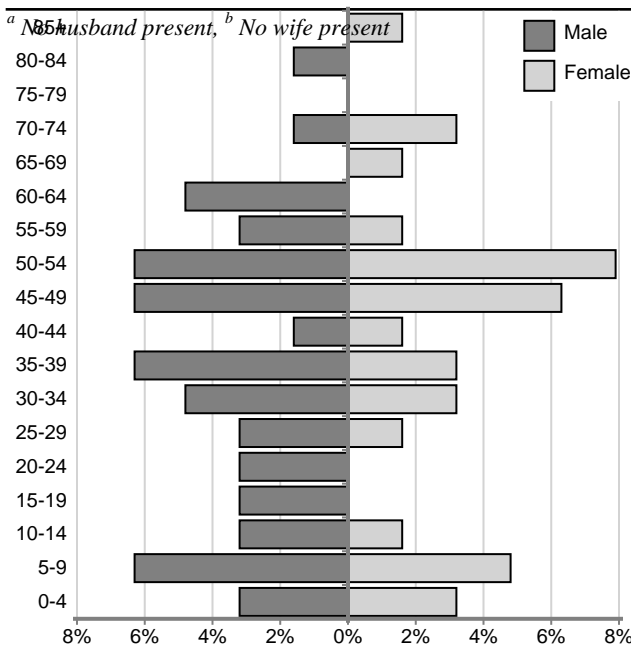
Bevington, Iowa

The City of Bevington, compared to Warren County, had a lower percentage of young people (17 or younger) and a lower percentage of older people (65 and older) in 2010. Bevington, Iowa Population Pyramid, 2010^{1,6}

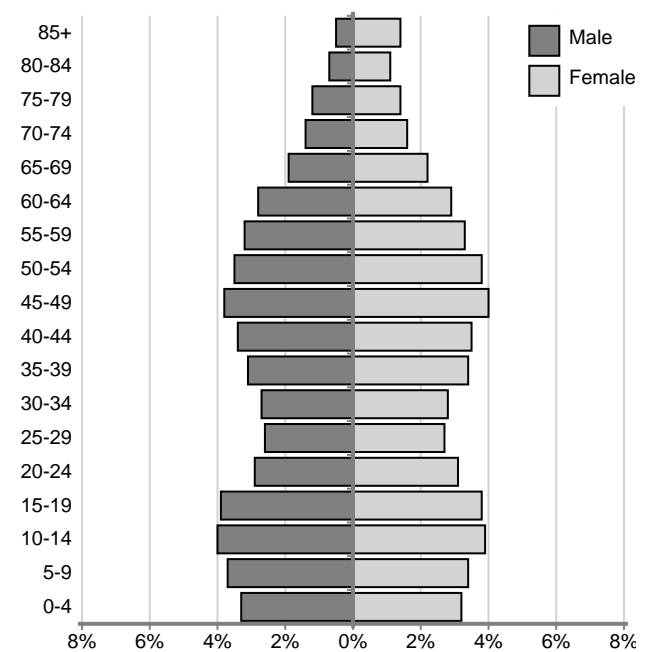

- ⁶ Population Pyramids represent the age-sex composition of a population. Bars may be missing if particular age-sex groups are missing from the population.
